Quotations received will be evaluated in terms of Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act 5 of 2000, the Preferential Procurement Regulations 2022 and Pikitup Supply Chain Management Policy. The 80/20 preference point system is applicable for this Request for Quotation (RFQ). Evaluation process will be firstly on pre-compliance evaluation, then on functionality evaluation (if applicable) and thereafter 80/20-Preference Point System. The 80 points will be for Price and 20 points are for Specific goals.

SECTION 2- BID CONDITIONS AND REQUIREMENTS

1. The Lowest or any bid will not necessarily be accepted and the PIKITUP reserves the right not to consider any bid not suitably endorsed or comprehensively completed as well as the right to accept a bid in whole or part. In addition, Pikitup also reserves the right to appoint more than one service provider/supplier as deemed necessary
2. In evaluating bids received and adjudicating the award of this bid, Pikitup Johannesburg (SOC) Limited will, in addition to the pre-compliance and functionality criteria included in the specifications and irrespective of the capital, pricing and black economic empowerment structures of the bidder, take into account as objective criteria (1) the desirability of rotating the work amongst service providers, (2) the past bidding practices of any bidder in relation to evidence and/or reports of combative practices including conduct reported, amongst others, in terms of the Prevention and Combatting of Corrupt Activities Act, 2004, (3) the past contractual performance of any bidder and (4) the nature and extent of disputes involving the bidder in relation to past and/or current contracts. Note that as a result of the application of these objective criteria, the highest scoring bidders will not necessarily be selected as a preferred bidder.
3. Where deliveries are quoted "ex-stock" the period of delivery must not exceed Five (5) maximum working days after receipt of order. If this condition is not adhered to, the order could be cancelled.

- a) Price; and
- b) Specific Goals.

1.4 The maximum points for this tender are allocated as follows:

TERMS OF REFERENCE

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Corporate Profile / Overview of Pikitup

Pikitup Johannesburg (SOC) Limited was established in 2001 as an independent municipal entity, wholly owned by the City of Johannesburg, to serve and provide waste management services in the Greater Johannesburg area. Pikitup vision is "to be *the* pioneering and environmentally focused waste management company in Africa". The City, by means of the service delivery agreement as monitored by the Infrastructure and Services Department of the City, regulates the service delivery in respect of the following:

- Financial services (annual operating and capital budgetary allocations and appropriate tariff levels), and
- Levels of service delivery in the different market segments covered by Pikitup.

1.2 Major Products and Services

Pikitup in terms of the service delivery agreement is contracted to the City of Johannesburg to provide a wide range of waste management services to its citizens. Pikitup provides two categories of services, viz. Council services and commercial services. The Council services, which the City of Johannesburg has mandated Pikitup to provide exclusively, comprise of the collection and disposal of domestic, business and putrescible waste, street cleaning, lane flushing, area cleaning, the management of litter bins, the collection of illegally dumped waste, the collection and disposal of animal carcasses found in a public place and the operation of garden sites.

The commercial services, which Pikitup provides in competition with other private waste management companies, comprise of the collection and treatment of healthcare risk waste, bulk collection services, the collection and disposal of waste, composting, recycling activities, providing services for special events and the operation of landfill sites. Pikitup executes its mandate to the city and its residents through 12 depots, 4 landfill sites, 42 garden sites and one composting site called Panorama based in Ruimsig.

2. PURPOSE OF THE REQUEST FOR QUOTATION (RFQ)

The purpose of the RFQ is to procure a service provider to investigate in terms of the Municipal Finance Management Act (MFMA) and best practices on the findings raised by the AGSA in their 2023/24 year-end audit, regarding co-operatives that were appointed through panels of services providers, on the Extended Public Works Program (EPWP).

2.1 Note that the quotation must reflect cost of the investigation project (including disbursements).

The estimated hour for this project is 200 hours.

3. MONDATORY TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

The bidder must have experience in providing investigation services in the Public Sector and must maintain a professional investigation/audit team with sufficient knowledge, skills, experience and

appropriate professional certifications to meet the requirements of the Internal Audit charter. Certified proof of registration with the relevant professional body. – e.g. IRBA or IIASA or SAICA or ACFE

3.1 QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS

Bidders must provide evidence of company experience and the set of team qualifications and specialist skills and experience:

PROJECT MANAGER

- Qualified Chartered Accountant CA(SA)/Law/Criminology/Forensic auditing or investigation qualification and Certified Fraud Examiner (CFE),
- Post Graduate Qualification in Forensic auditing and investigation /Accounting/ Auditing/Law/ Criminology (NQF level 8), or
- Degree or equivalent qualification in Forensic Auditing / Accounting/ Auditing/ Criminology (NQF level 7)
- Registration with the Independent Regulatory Board for Auditors (IRBA) South African Institute of Chartered Accountants (SAICA) or Institute of Internal Auditors of South Africa (IIASA) or Association for Certified Fraud Examiners (ACFE)
- All qualifications must be SAQA accredited

AUDITOR/INVESTIGATOR

- Post graduate qualification in Forensic Auditing/ Accounting/Auditing/Criminology (NQF level 8) or
- Degree or equivalent qualification in Forensic Auditing/ Accounting/Auditing/Criminology (NQF level 7).
- Minimum of three (3) years' forensic audit/ auditing working experience.
- Registration with the Independent Regulatory Board for Auditors (IRBA) South African Institute of Chartered Accountants (SAICA) or Institute of Internal Auditors of South Africa (IIASA) or Association for Certified Fraud Examiners (ACFE)

Bidder/s must provide evidence of company experience and the set of team qualifications and specialist skills and experience. Bidder/s must attach certified copies of the original qualifications and professional body registrations with CV's of the professionals who will be assigned to the projects meeting the above requirements.

4. SCOPE OF WORK.

The scope of work will include the conducting of a detailed investigation. The project scope will include (but not be limited to) the following:

- 4.1 To investigate the veracity/validity of the audit findings reported by AGSA in their 2023/24 year-end audit. The audit findings reported by AGSA on co-operatives are as follows:
 - a) Co-operatives registered for EPWP and are not submitting declarations.

- b) Co-operatives not registered for UIF. The auditor notes that co-operatives are not registered for UIF and this poses a risk that the EPWP workers might not actually be in the employ of the co-operatives. The auditors recommend that management request evidence of UIF declarations and filing thereof to ensure that contracting conditions are complied with by the respective co-operatives.
- c) Ages of EPWP contractors. AGSA noted that section 13 of the approved bid specification required that the tenderers must submit a signed confirmation letter, confirming that they will hire 100% of EPWP participants between the ages of 18 to 35 years of age. According to the CAATS results, the auditors noted that approximately 1335 individuals who were above the age threshold stipulated in the tender document and these individual's ages ranged from 38 to 75 years respectively. Furthermore, there is a risk that the EPWP workers identified from the CAATS may not be bona fide employees of the co-operatives considering that there is a total of 297 EPWP workers that are within the age brackets 50 years to 75 years.
- d) Deceased employees appointed after their deceased date. The auditors utilized the Home Affairs database to identify the status of the EPWP workers and noted that two employees listed as EPWP workers had a deceased date which is before their appointment date by the co-operative.
- e) EPWP workers in the employ of the state. During the audit of contract management, the auditors utilized CAATs to confirm whether the EPWP workers were employed by government. Based on the CAATS performed, the auditors noted that certain employees employed by the co-operatives were government employees. The auditor notes that the respective co-operatives may have claimed payments for such employees, thus, there is a risk that payments were made for services that were not rendered.
- f) Invoices not reconciled to the timesheets. During the audit of sampled co-operatives invoices, the auditors have identified various discrepancies between the invoices and timesheets submitted to support the invoices. The above issues are indicative of poor contract monitoring processes in this panel of cooperatives and a possible financial loss for the entity. Furthermore, this places a limitation on the auditor in confirming that the payments made were for services that were rendered as we cannot confirm that the EPWP workers (including loaders, supervisors) that the co-operative charged the entity for, were at work.
- g) The Bid specification not fair and equitable. The AGSA noted that specification was restrictive in that only co-operatives were allowed to submit their tenders, and no other form of entities were allowed.
- h) Contracts with co-operatives do not comply with policy and National Treasury requirements. The AGSA noted that the contract signed with a specific co-operative dated 23 October 2023 was not prepared in accordance with section 14 of the Pikitup SCM Policy which states that Pikitup shall develop general conditions of bid and contract which will at least include the General Conditions of Contracts issued by National Treasury and will apply these conditions for all bids and contract not subject to CIDB regulations. Furthermore, this contract was not based on the General

Conditions of Contracts as issued by National Treasury as required by Municipal SCM Regulation 21(1)(a) read with National Treasury Municipal Circular 25 together with section 14 (1.5 – 1.7) of the Pikitup SCM Policy.

- i) Bidders sent documents used for functionality evaluation after the tender closing date. During the audit of procurement PU120/2022 the auditors noted indications that some of the winning bidders that were sampled for audit purposes had submitted information that was required after the bid closing date of 19 May 2023. (flagged as possible fraud risk)
- j) Limitation on confirmation of tax status of one of the winning bidder requirements.
- k) Possible misrepresentation by some of the bidders' requirements.
- l) Co-operatives issued invoices including VAT whereas they are not registered for VAT.

4.2 Determine who is responsible for the non-compliance and lack of contract management.

4.3 Determine if any person deliberately caused the findings made by the AGSA.

4.4 Investigate any irregular, fruitless and wasteful expenditure related to the Co-ops panel and establish who is responsible for causing the respective expenditure.

5. PROJECT TEAM

The appointed service provider will be required to allocate specific members to be dedicated to these assignments. Declaration letters of availability for the team members must be attached, and in case of resignation of one of members, the service provider must inform us in writing and immediately replace such a member with another team member of the same stature e.g. same expertise, skills, qualifications and experience with the environment.

6. REPORTING

The successful supplier will be expected to submit a detailed report to the Chief Audit Executive or his delegated official on a weekly basis till completion of the project on the progress of the project. The service provider may be required to make presentations to relevant governance structures of Pikitup.
